Motion to seat Mr. Ambrose-Sauer and Mr. Cecchinato as regular Commissioners for this meeting made by Ms. Simoncelli and seconded by Mr. Hillman. Motion unanimously carried.

A. Applications

- 2. Application #2362, Sharon Sahl, 173 Meadow St., to replace windows. The Commission reviewed the application.

V. Correspondence

Ms. Simoncelli read into the minutes an email from Devin Burkhart to the Borough of Litchfield regarding his concern about newly replaced street light fixtures on West Street which he believes are not historic-looking and are too bright. See the email attached to the end of the minutes.

The Commission discussed the lights and states for the record that these replaced lights were not applied for and therefore not approved by the Commission. These lights are in noncompliance with HDC regulations. If these lights were related to the Litchfield Heritage plan, the Commission also states for the record that the Heritage plan was not approved by the HDC, as the Heritage Plan primarily does not relate to structures, which are within the HDC's purview. Any structure-related changes of the Heritage Plan must be applied for via an HDC application for a Certificate of Appropriateness.

The Commission suggested that HDC Chair Metcalf will contact First Selectman and Borough Warden Gayle Carr, to identify who replaced the light fixtures and under what authority. A call to Eversource may be required to understand their role in the change.
