

Borough of Litchfield Board of Warden & Burgesses Special Meeting Minutes Wednesday, March 27, 2024

Call to order: Meeting Called to Order at 5: 37 p.m.

1. Discussion: Blight Ordinance:

- a. Discussion commenced of details regarding the Litchfield Borough Blight Ordinance
- b. Details included:
 - i. Timing of notice and where to find the ordinance posted on the website
 - ii. Purpose to be amended and reflect details from Town of Salem re: "historic value"
 - iii. Scope to be amended to include "agricultural", wetlands to remain in narrative
 - iv. Discussion of blight related to, but not limited to:
 - 1. definition of debris
 - 2. vehicles (specified as those that are inoperable, unregistered)
 - 3. fire or "damage caused by fire" (action: added to 'E')
 - 4. graffiti (action: to remove from ordinance)
 - v. "Director of Health" to be TAHD liaison
 - vi. Neighborhood defined as "the Borough"
 - vii. 36-5 B. 'HDC' to replace "Litchfield Historic District"
 - 1. Action of blight ordinance to be stayed pending business in front of HDC
 - viii. Fees Enforcement
 - 1. Fees can be amended upon compliance
 - 2. Fees will be amended to be in alignment with similar towns
 - 3. Appeal language discussed and clarified for when fees can be waived; acknowledgement of disability or elderly status accepted
 - ix. Update to the Blight List
 - 1. Determined that list will be updated at the "commission's discretion" but not less than annually

2. Restaurant Ordinance

- a. Discussion commenced regarding the restaurant ordinance with minor edits including:
 - i. Lighting to be installed through approval only

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- ii. 'seasonal' to be defined (May through Columbus Day weekend)
- iii. Under 'B' (For ADA compliance) '4 ft' will be amended to read '6 ft'
- iv. Reapplication will occur annually; permit will only be allowed for one season and reapplication will be required

3. Budget

- a. Two versions of the budget (1.7 and 1.8 mill rate) were presented
- b. 1.8 mill rate version presented as the recommended budget
- c. Budgets designed to offset impact of new town assessment (leading to increase in taxes of 35% on average)
- d. Details included:
 - i. Discussion of sidewalk cost as capital expense
 - ii. Fire Marshall request for thermal imaging cameras (\$8,000)
- e. Will follow up at next meeting with more discussion and motion to pay for request from Fire Marshall
